Wisconsin Exported \$4.22 billion in Agricultural products to 142 countries in 2022. We were first in the US in exports of specialty cheese. The largest increase was in Cheese, milk, whey and butter.

Our top export markets included Canada, China, Mexico, Korea and Japan



Wisconsin Dairy Exports First Quarter Highlights



Wisconsin dairy exports are down this quarter 2.5% from 2022 which was a record year. This is a \$4 million dollar reduction. The total for all dairy products for the quarter is \$124 million.

Wisconsin remains number 12 in agricultural exports in the U.S. and number one in specialty cheeses.

The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) offers resources to help you craft and implement your export strategy and boost your international sales.

The International Market Access Grant Program provides qualifying companies with grants of up to \$25,000 to help cover their export growth expenses. Applications are reviewed and approved on a rolling basis. Companies are encouraged to apply as soon as possible as WEDC's fiscal year started July 1.

Legislative Update

State Budget

The Wisconsin state budget was signed into law on July 5^{th.} The \$99 billion two-year spending package included big wins for the dairy industry.

Dairy Processor Grant Program

\$1 million annually was provided to continue and expand <u>this</u> successful grant program. Funding up to \$50,000 is available on a competitive basis for upgrades, modernization, and training. Applications will begin in January and grants awarded in April of 2024. See the next page for additional grant opportunities that are available now.

Agricultural Roads Improvement Program

The budget provides \$150 million for the <u>recently passed Ag Roads Improvement Program (ARIP</u>). The ARIP creates a dedicated funding source for local roads, bridges and culverts that provide access to agricultural land or facilities used for the production of agricultural goods. The grant may fund up to 90% of the cost of the project. The poor condition of many of these local roads and bridges have restricted the ability of farmers to move products both onto and off the farm efficiently. The passage of this program and the funding provided in the budget is a great win for the agriculture industry.

Dairy Innovation Hub

The budget bill provided \$7.8 million annually in continued funding for the Dairy Innovation Hub as part of the University of Wisconsin budget. This funding is important in supporting dairy research to ensure that Wisconsin remains America's Dairyland. Assembly Bill 245 – Repeal of Business Personal Property Tax

Assembly Bill 245, signed in to law by Governor Evers as Act 12 made several changes to shared revenue. Beginning January 2024 all business personal property tax is repealed.

The tax dates back to the 1800's and many exceptions have been passed over the years. This legislation is a long overdue repeal of a burdensome tax that is a very small portion of state and local revenue. The new law also requires the state to provide aid to local government to make up for the revenue lost through this appeal. This article provides a great explanation.

Dairy Business Builder Grant Program Application Period Starts August 21st

This grant program is targeted at small-to-medium size farmers or processors for projects aimed at diversifying on-farm activity, creating value-added products, enhancing dairy by-products or export programs. Awards are for up to \$100,000 in reimbursable grants.

Dairy Industry Impact Grant Application Period Starts August 21st

This grant program is for targeted topic areas that have the potential to positively impact the dairy industry as a whole. The Fall 2023 grant cycle is for projects related to exporting dairy products.

Applicants may apply to both the Dairy Business Builder grant and the Dairy Industry Impact grant if they have two separate projects related to DBIA goals. All export applications will be evaluated under the Dairy Industry Impact program and companies are eligible to receive awards from both programs in one grant cycle. Awards of up to \$100,000 in reimbursable grants will be made.
